

STEWARDSHIP PLAN OUTLINE

Development of a site stewardship plan is an eligible cost activity. An outline for the stewardship plan must be submitted with after closing (required within 12 months of closing), however the timing will be dependent on the individual project agreement. Consult with the awarding program manager to determine stewardship plan requirements. At a minimum, it must contain the following elements:

- Long-term stewardship goals and objectives
- Monitoring goals and objectives
- Restoration goals and objectives (if applicable)
- Short-term land management goals and objectives
- A detailed stewardship plan implementation budget that also identifies the source of funding

Description of the project area, including the following:

- U.S. Geological Survey quadrant map and county assessor's parcel map
- Map showing all human-made and natural features
- Narrative description of the property
- Photographs taken at permanent photograph points

Recipient must upload an electronic version of the stewardship plan, and any amendments to it, into EAGL (Ecology Administration of Grants and Loans system). For projects funded through the Community Flood Resilience and Assistance (CFAR) program, recipient must send an electronic version to the OCB project management team.
